Coleridge in Wales Festival

29th July 2016 : 7.30pm : Herb Garden Café

The Coleridge in Wales Festival, inspired by the work of Samuel Taylor Coleridge, is an 80 day journey around Wales in search of 'hidden welsh treasures'. Coleridge is best known for his poems, especially 'The Ancient Mariner' and 'Kubla Khan', but he also wrote and spoke a great deal about his ideas on society and community. His walk through Wales in 1794 inspired many of the ideas he later developed, both in his poetry and prose writings.

Richard Parry (baritone, community activist, student of Coleridge's poetry and ideas on community) is re-enacting Coleridge's walk through Wales in order to stimulate discussion about what we mean by community (www.coleridgefestival.org) Richard is a trained singer but also an expert on conciliation.

Led by Richard, you will enjoy a delicious two course Welsh meal locally sourced by Wales' hidden treasure The Herb Garden, alongside offerings of poetry, songs, readings and discussion by or about Samuel Taylor Coleridge (www.herbgardencafe.co.uk)
