

Minutes of TLT Steering Group Meeting, 7.30pm, 11th November 2025

Present were: Geoff, Janice, Sian, Penny, Sally

1. October minutes and matters arising

Minutes agreed. Sally said there was a misspelling of Blackthorne. PN to amend.

The Wassailing idea had not progressed. **Sally will** run it past Becks at the Blackthorne Trust. It would need quite a bit of work. I could be the other side of Christmas. One tradition had it on 12th Night. Food and drink could be provided – **PN to liaise** with Hilary and I.E. (Dorienne) about refreshments.

Sian was making the Morsbags (free, homemade, fabric bags) and had obtained TLT labels for them, as a result of liaising with Lucy. She needs more outlets to give them away. **Sally will** talk to Van's and the Library to see if they would agree to give them out.

The October talk had been excellent on the subject of historic honey and bee rescue. James had brought wax and wicks for everyone to make a candle and had honey and other items for sale. He gave an interesting talk and answered many questions. **PN to** send email of thanks.

Sally had been unable to find the Transition Together film for January.

PN to email Hilary (and David) re posters for more trustees for the Rock Park.

2. Project updates:

- a) Green Coffee – Janice reported this had been well-attended, however, Bradleys had been closed, which necessitated the group de-camping to the Commodore Hotel. This was a much more comfortable, convenient and audible experience, with coffee prices comparable. It was decided that the venue for Green Coffee would change to The Commodore with immediate effect. **PN to ask David** to amend the posters for distribution.

b) Incredible Edible and Seed Library –

No report from Catherine this time. However, she has been putting up her seed stall weekly at the Friday morning Alleyway Market of locally produced veg, meat, eggs, bread, preserves and cakes, which helps raise the profile, distribute seeds, engage people in a conversation about growing and gather donations.

c) Pomarium and Forest Garden –

An email had been received from Hilary as follows:

Pomarium - I'm very pleased to say that we have acquired two new volunteers, a young couple who have just moved back to Llan'dod and are very keen to help at the Pom.

I have also been in touch with Grace from the Radnorshire Wildlife Trust who is going to come and have a chat with us about encouraging new volunteers. We had a meeting arranged for this Thursday, but she could not make it and will contact me when she is able to make another date.

I will get around to making posters and FB posts but at present I am very busy.

d) Repair Café and Morsbags

Repair Cafe: still going well, and we are again going to be open in December and January, which in fact will be the norm for all years from now on, by public and volunteer demand!

The October RC, which happened after the last SG meeting, celebrated a week early International Repair Day on 18th October, and we had cakes with our teas.
